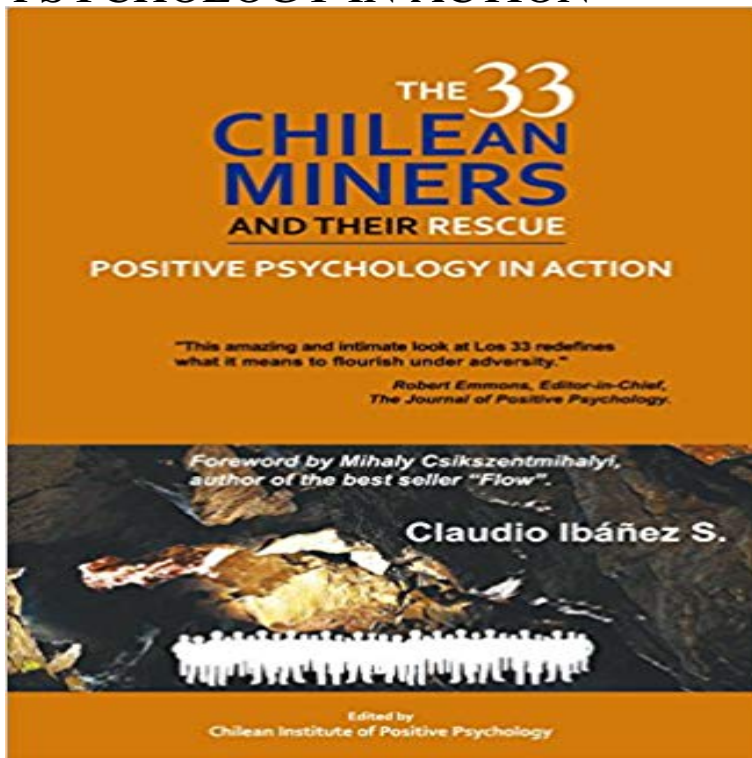


THE 33 CHILEAN MINERS AND THEIR RESCUE: POSITIVE PSYCHOLOGY IN ACTION

In the midst of the pessimistic predictions that proliferated during those early days after the mine collapsed, the author wisely sets out to rescue hope, offering a new way to interpret the catastrophe from the lens of Positive Psychology.
